
DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT FOR THE INSTALLATION OF ROAD APPROACHES

The applicant must supply the necessary culvert of proper size for drainage. The culvert shall be a new culvert, shall be a minimum of 400 mm in diameter, 2. and shall extend 40 cm on each side of the approach toe of slope. 3. Top of approach shall be a minimum of 8 m. Side slopes of approach shall be 3 to 1. 4. No excavation shall be made in borrow ditch except to lower culverts. 5. 6. No fill shall be used from borrow pit; all fill shall be hauled in. Approaches off gravelled roads shall be gravelled with crushed gravel. 7. 8. Slopes of approach to be grassed based on enclosed mix design. 9. All disturbed areas, except the driving surface of the approach, must be seeded with a grass seed mixture. Prior to seeding the disturbed area, the Agricultural Fieldsman must approve both the mixture to be used and the application rate of that mixture. For Mix 10. Recommendations and Approvals see Agricultural Fieldsman There will be a zero tolerance in the mixture for weed seeds that are classed as prohibited or noxious under the Weed Control Act or that have been 11. elevated to a restricted or noxious weed status through a Cardston County Bylaw. This will be verified by the Applicant providing the Agricultural Fieldsman with a Certificate of Analysis. A list of prohibited and noxious weeds is attached to this Agreement. (See Schedule "A") 12. All costs to be borne by the Applicant. The County shall inspect said approach for compliance. If approach is on temporary basis, the Applicant shall bear all costs of removal and clean-up. 14. The County must be contacted at 403 653-4977 prior to the commencement of the installation of the approach. 15. The Applicant agrees that the approach will be constructed within 6 months of entering into this agreement, failure to do so will result in loss of 16. security deposit. If the Applicant does not cause the approach to be constructed prior to the date indicated in Clause 16 (expiry date) and, in accordance with the 17. specifications outlined in this agreement, the County may cause the approach to be constructed and any costs incurred by the County in doing so will be a debt owed by the Applicant to the County. 18. The Applicant hereby agrees that it shall indemnify and save harmless the County, its elected officials, officers, employees, servants, agents and contractors with respect to any claim, action, suit, proceeding or demand made or brought against the County, its elected officials, officers, employees, servants, agents and contractors by any third party with respect to any occurrence, incident, accident or happening directly related in any manner whatsoever to this Agreement and the rights and obligations arising therefrom, and which indemnity shall, without restricting the generality of the foregoing, include all legal costs incurred by the County in defending such a claim, action, suit, proceeding or demand, provided such action, claim, suit, proceeding or demand are not

the result of any wilful act, omission or negligence of the County, its elected officials, officers, employees, servants, agents and contractors. (continued...)

 The Applicant hereby agrees that it shall not make or bring any claim, action, suit, proceeding or demand against the County, its elected officials, officers, employees, servants, agents and contractors with respect to any occurrence, incident, accident or happening relating in any manner whatsoever to this agreement and the rights and obligations arising there from, which, without limiting the generality of the foregoing shall include any claim, action, suit, proceeding or demand arising in tort or contract, providing such claim, action, suit, proceeding or demand is not the result of any willful act or negligence of the County, its elected officials, officers, employees, servants, agents or contractors. Notwithstanding the foregoing, in no event shall the County ever be liable to the Applicant for any consequential, indirect or special damages. Special damages shall include, but not be limited to, the value associated with any loss of product or goods. The County shall be entitled to register a caveat against the said lands to protect its interest under this Agreement at the applicant's expense.

E No excavation shall be made in the borrow ditch except to lower culverts, if required. F No fill shall be used from the borrow pit; all fill shall be hauled in. G Slopes of the approach are to be grassed. H Approach surface shall be graveled. I All costs for maintaining and/or upgrading the approach are to be borne by the applicant. J The County shall be contacted at 653-4977 prior to the upgrading of the approach. K Existing cover on the culvert must be increased to centimeters of cover.
