<b>BAREROOT</b>			
1053	<b>Goodland Apple</b> - <i>an early apple, ready to harvest in mid-August. The large apples have a delightful mild and aromatic flavor. They are equally good to eat fresh as when cooked.</i>	5-6' BR #07 Pot	55.00 80.00
1051	<b>Hardi-Mac Apple</b> - <i>White with pink tinted fragrant flowers in spring produce bright red fruit with white, juicy crisp texture in mid September. Excellent for eating or baking</i>	6' BR #07 Pot	65.00 80.00
1052	<b>Honey Crisp Apple</b> – <i>these apples are good for applesauce and baking. They are also an exceptionally good keeping apple and can be stored for up to 3 – 4 months in the refrigerator</i>	6' BR #07 Pot	65.00 80.00
1122	<b>Patmore Elm</b> – <i>a fast growing tree with dark green foliage that turns bright yellow in the fall. An excellent shade tree that adapts well to a variety of soil conditions.</i>	7-8' BR	70.00
1123	<b>Brandon Elm</b> - <i>has a more upright vase shape with a dense ascending branch structure. Dark green, rough toothed leaves turn yellow in fall.</i>	7-8' BR	70.00
1125	<b>Patmore Green Ash</b> – <i>One of the best general purpose shade trees for cold climates; extremely hardy, very clean and tidy with a symmetrical rounded shape and glossy foliage, seedless, adaptable to almost any conditions.</i>	8' BR	65.00
1137	<b>May Day</b> – <i>Vigorous rounded tree leafs out early in spring. Large clusters of fragrant white flowers in early May followed by small black fruit that attracts birds. Dark green foliage turns yellowish red in fall.</i>	8' BR	75.00
1143	<b>Gladiator Flowering Crab</b> – <i>an excellent ornamental tree with a profusion of bright pink flowers followed by small reddish-purple fruit on a stately, upright crown.</i>	8' BR	70.00
1144	<b>Japanese Lilac</b> – <i>a compact, sturdy tree that has showy fragrant blooms. Resistant to most pests and diseases, transplants well.</i>	6-7' BR	65.00
1130	<b>Prairie Sky Poplar</b> – <i>upright spreading habit of growth. Its relatively coarse texture can be used to stand it apart from other landscape plants with finer foliage. Fast growing tree that tolerates the worst growing conditions</i>	1 Yr Whip 3-5'	12.00
<b>SHRUBS</b>			
1118	<b>Caragana</b> – <i>grows to 10-16'. Has an upright growing habit. Can be multi-branched or single stemmed. Caragana has a rapid growth rate when young and slows down when older.</i>	2-3'	5.00
1151	<b>Laurel Leaf Willow</b> – <i>One of the first to leaf out in spring and last to drop its leaves in fall. Attractive glossy leaves and round crown. Fast growing and has an aggressive root system so it is best planted in areas away from buildings.</i>	3-5'	8.00
1142	<b>Villosa Lilac</b> - <i>A beautiful, late, light purple flowering Lilac</i>	2-3'	5.00

1141	<b>Common Lilac</b> – dark purple flowers, makes excellent hedge or wind break. Height 12’, 8’ wide	2-3’	5.00

<b>POTTED TREES</b>			
1136	<b>Linden</b> – medium to large shade trees; they tend to have thick, pillar-like trunks with dark bark that begins smooth but develops furrows as the tree matures. They have dark green heart shaped leaves, which are similar to aspen tree leaves but much larger.	#07	80.00
1129	<b>Sargent Poplar</b> – a deciduous tree with a more or less rounded form. Its relatively coarse texture can be used to stand it apart from other landscape plants with finer foliage	#02	30.00
1140	<b>Quaking Aspen</b> – 40-50’ and a spread of 20-30’ at maturity. This tree grows at a fast rate, with height increases of more than 24” per year.	#07	80.00
1139	<b>Ohio Buckeye</b> - The Ohio buckeye is a neatly rounded tree with low, sweeping branches and dense foliage that provides deep shade. It is one of the first trees to leaf out in the spring.	#02 #05	35.00 70.00
1131	<b>Swedish Aspen</b> – will grow to be about 45’ tall at maturity, with a spread of 5’. It has a low canopy with a typical clearance of 5’ from the ground.	#05	70.00
1155	<b>Ivory Halo Dogwood</b> - Compact deciduous shrub. Green and white variegated leaves in summer and bright red twigs in winter. Small white flowers in spring.	#02	30.00
1160	<b>Amur Maple</b> – A large shrub that has glossy green foliage. The leaves are lobed and spread out throughout the leaves are sprays of small, fragrant yellow colored blooms on the branches. In Fall the leaves become a brilliant scarlet-red. An extremely hardy plant. Great used as a border, hedge, or in dry areas.	#05	65.00
1165	<b>Hydrangea Pink Diamond</b> - a vigorous deciduous shrub with panicles of creamy white flowers which fade to deep pink, from late summer into autumn.	#05	55.00
1166	<b>Hydrangea Limelight</b> - Large flowers have a unique color that looks great with any style and color of house. Blooms every year, even in cold climates.	#05	55.00
