| 1053 | Goodland Apple - <i>an early apple, ready to harvest in mid-August. The large apples have a delightful mild and aromatic flavor. They are equally good to eat fresh as when cooked.</i> | 5-6' BR #07 Pot | 55.00 82.50 |
| 1051 | Hardi-Mac Apple - <i>White with pink tinted fragrant flowers in spring produce bright red fruit with white, juicy crisp texture in mid September. Excellent for eating or baking</i> | 6' BR #07 Pot | 66.00 82.50 |
| 1122 | Patmore Elm – <i>a fast growing tree with dark green foliage that turns bright yellow in the fall. An excellent shade tree that adapts well to a variety of soil conditions.</i> | 5' BR | 49.50 |
| 1125 | Patmore Green Ash - <i>One of the best general purpose shade trees for cold climates; extremely hardy, very clean and tidy with a symmetrical rounded shape and glossy foliage, seedless, adaptable to almost any conditions.</i> | 7-8' BR 1" Cal | 66.00 |
| 1137 | May Day – <i>Vigorous rounded tree leafs out early in spring. Large clusters of fragrant white flowers in early May followed by small black fruit that attracts birds. Dark green foliage turns yellowish red in fall.</i> | 5' BR | 55.00 |
| 1143 | Gladiator Flowering Crab – <i>an excellent ornamental tree with a profusion of bright pink flowers followed by small reddish-purple fruit on a stately, upright crown.</i> | 7' BR | 60.50 |
| 1144 | Japanese Lilac – <i>a compact, sturdy tree that has showy fragrant blooms. Resistant to most pests and diseases, transplants well.</i> | 6-7' BR | 66.00 |
| 1130 | Prairie Sky Poplar – <i>upright spreading habit of growth. Its relatively coarse texture can be used to stand it apart from other landscape plants with finer foliage. Fast growing tree that tolerates the worst growing conditions</i> | 1 Yr Whip 3-5' | 11.00 |

| 1151 | Laurel Leaf Willow – <i>One of the first to leaf out in spring and last to drop its leaves in fall. Attractive glossy leaves and round crown. Fast growing and has an aggressive root system so it is</i> | 3-5' | 7.00 |

| 1142 | Villosa Lilac - <i>A beautiful, late, light purple flowering Lilac which makes an excellent hedge or windbreak. Hardy and non suckering trees thrive under most conditions.</i> | 2-3' | 6.50 |
| 1141 | Pekin Lilac - <i>grows in an open, multi-stemmed form to a height of 15 to 20 feet, with a spread of 10 to 15 feet. Large clusters of beautiful white flowers in the spring. Perfect for any yard, Peking Lilac does not sucker, seldom suffers from disease, and requires little pruning.</i> | 2-3' | 6.50 |

| 1052 | Honey Crisp Apple – <i>these apples are good for applesauce and baking. They are also an exceptionally good keeping apple and can be stored for up to 3 to 4 months in the refrigerator.</i> | #07 | 82.50 |
| 1136 | Linden – <i>medium to large shade trees; they tend to have thick, pillar-like trunks with dark bark that begins smooth but develops furrows as the tree matures. They have dark green heart shaped leaves, which are similar to aspen tree leaves but much larger.</i> | #07 | 86.00 |
| 1129 | Sargent Poplar – <i>a deciduous tree with a more or less rounded form. Its relatively coarse texture can be used to stand it apart from other landscape plants with finer foliage</i> | #02 | 24.00 |
| 1140 | Quaking Aspen – <i>40-50' and a spread of 20-30' at maturity. This tree grows at a fast rate, with height increases of more than 24" per year.</i> | #07 | 85.50 |
| 1139 | Ohio Buckeye - <i>The Ohio buckeye is a neatly rounded tree with low, sweeping branches and dense foliage that provides deep shade. It is one of the first trees to leaf out in the spring.</i> | #05 | 71.50 |
| 1131 | Swedish Aspen – <i>will grow to be about 45' tall at maturity, with a spread of 5'. It has a low canopy with a typical clearance of 5' from the ground.</i> | #05 #07 | 71.50 88.00 |
| 1340 | Double Flowering Plum – <i>One of the showiest of all garden shrubs when in bloom, this tall spreading shrub becomes a uniformly frothy cloud of double pink flowers in early spring.</i> | #10 | 75.00 |
