1142	Villosa Lilac - A beautiful, late, light purple flowering Lilac which makes an excellent hedge or windbreak. Hardy and non suckering trees thrive under most conditions.	2-3'	6.50		
1141	Pekin Lilac - grows in an open, multi-stemmed form to a height of 15 to 20 feet, with a spread of 10 to 15 feet. Large clusters of beautiful white flowers in the spring. Perfect for any yard, Peking Lilac does not sucker, seldom suffers from disease, and requires little pruning.	2-3'	6.50

1052	Honey Crisp Apple – these apples are good for applesauce and baking. They are also an exceptionally good keeping apple and can be stored for up to 3 to 4 months in the refrigerator.	#07	82.50
1136	Linden – medium to large shade trees; they tend to have thick, pillar-like trunks with dark bark that begins smooth but develops furrows as the tree matures. They have dark green heart shaped leaves, which are similar to aspen tree leaves but much larger.	#07	86.00
1129	Sargent Poplar – a deciduous tree with a more or less rounded form. Its relatively coarse texture can be used to stand it apart from other landscape plants with finer foliage	#02	24.00
1140	Quaking Aspen – 40-50' and a spread of 20-30' at maturity. This tree grows at a fast rate, with height increases of more than 24" per year.	#07	85.50
1139	Ohio Buckeye - The Ohio buckeye is a neatly rounded tree with low, sweeping branches and dense foliage that provides deep shade. It is one of the first trees to leaf out in the spring.	#05	71.50
